BILINGUAL DICTIONARIES CHILD/DOG – DOG/CHILD 60 words for a peaceful life together

Having a dog means building a relationship and sharing one's house with a new family member. Getting a pet dog can be the beginning of a wonderful friendship or of a difficult relationship between dog and child, which can lead to potential tensions and worries. For this reason, knowing and understanding the way dogs communicate can allow us to better interpret their needs and behaviours and to create a happy and healthy relationship with them. The dictionary is divided into three parts. The first, dog/child, explains what the most common dog behaviours mean. The second, child/dog, illustrates how the dog perceives our behaviour, whereas the final part, dog/dog, focuses on the interaction among dogs, helping us understand what to do when our friend meets other dogs.

The dictionary also includes a brief overview of the historical evolution of the friendship between dogs and humans.
